

Newsletter - June 2025

Dear Parents and Carers

We are now in the home straight, heading to the end of the school year. It always amazes me how quickly the time passes and before long our 3-5s children will be settling in their new 'Big Schools' and we will be welcoming 60 new families to Dorking Nursery.

As has been advertised in previous letters, the **last full day at nursery (normal hours) is Tuesday 15th July.** Wednesday 16th July is a **Stay and Play** fun day where we invite you to join your child for a shorter session. Emails were sent last week to everyone with specific details and the timings for you to come with your child on this day. Families will have been invited either to come with their child for the 10am - 11.30am session or the 12.30pm - 2pm session. If you ordered a 'Leavers T-shirt', they will be sent home soon with your child to wear on the 16th July if you wish to.

Parking - thank you to those who have been making an effort and respecting our car park, ensuring spaces are available for those with a permit or blue badge.

Black gate - thank you also to those who have been closing the black gate at the bottom of the drive. It really does help to keep everyone safe.

Termly donation - you may have seen a £10 termly donation on your School Money account. This is a voluntary contribution to enable to us to provide enhancements to our curriculum. This includes all breakfasts and snacks, Woodland and Forest School snacks, resources to make playdough and other sensory activities and much more. If you are able to make this donation, we are really grateful.

Fees for lunches and extended/additional sessions - please ensure accounts and payments are up to date in advance of the end of term, ideally by Friday 11th July so that we can reconcile our accounts before we break up . As per the terms and conditions, we ask for payment in advance of any sessions taken as we have to ensure the appropriate staffing is in place and order meals in advance.

For families returning to us in September - you will have had an email detailing your home visit, name of new key person and start date and time in September.

If you are **eligible for the Working Entitlement**, please ensure your code is renewed as soon as possible and let us know. If it is not renewed by the end of August, we may not be able to claim the funding which will impact on the sessions your child can attend.

For families leaving us in July - over the coming weeks we will be working with your child's new school to support a smooth transition. Leavers Reports will be sent home at the end of term for those children who were with us prior to this term and you will be emailed details of how to download your child's Tapestry Journal. We will also be collecting Book Bags in from Friday 11th July, in the 3-5s class, library books to be returned on this date.

For families of children going to Mainstream Schools, Jennifer, our Family Support Worker, will be holding a Transition Meeting to help you prepare your child for 'Big School'. This will take place on Friday 4th July at either 9.15am or 2pm.

Term dates - Please note the holiday closures at the end of the term and Surrey term dates, to access these on Surrey County Council website - <u>click here</u>.

Your key person - If at any time you need to talk to your child's key person, or a member of staff, do let us know. However, please note, your child's key person may not be able to talk to you at drop off and pick up, as they are in ratios and with the children, but we can make arrangements for a mutually convenient time. Alternatively, email the office

admin@dorking.surrey.sch.uk or call us on 01306 882397 and leave a message for the member of staff.

Collection at the end of the session - please note that staff will not send children to their parents at home time if they are on their mobile phones, either talking or scrolling on the screen. If that is the case, you will be asked to put your telephone away prior to your child being sent to you. There are also a considerable amount of parents who are late to collect their child, again this tends to happen more in the afternoon session. The local primary schools all finish earlier than our 3.30pm finish to enable parents to make two pick ups, please ensure you are arriving on time to collect your child.

Tapestry - If you have not done so already, do check your Tapestry account regularly. This is a great way to see what your child is interested in at nursery and to spark up a conversation with them about their learning.

It is wonderful to know that parents have seen the posts, so please do this by either commenting on the post or 'liking' it with the 'thumbs up'. Please feel free to add photos from home too! We love to see them. Your next update should be posted by the end of the month!

Parent feedback - I will shortly be sending out an online feedback form to gather your views about a variety of aspects of Dorking Nursery life. I would really appreciate you taking a few moments to do this as it really helps us to make improvements for future generations of Dorking Nursery School families.

Sun Safety

Please familiarise yourself with our sun safety policy and 'do's' and 'don't's:-

• Apply suncream prior to attending nursery

- If your child attends all day or does extended days, send a bottle of suncream into nursery that can be left onsite.
- Children must wear hats outside, please ensure this is named if your provide one for your child.
- No sunglasses, except prescription sunglasses.
- Shoes/footwear must be suitable for climbing and running. Sandals, open toes, sling backs, straps, crocs are not permitted. Trainers are ideal.
- Tops must cover shoulders strappy spaghetti straps do not provide suitable protection.
